Some of the highlights include two side trips to two of the local military installations. One was to the Top Gun School and the other to the Marine Corps Cold Weather Training Center. Aside from a couple of bus glitches all seemed to enjoy the visits and were impressed with the facilities.

During the reunion Dave Brown held a couple of sessions where he interviewed many of the attendees to get their stories for the book he is writing on Fox 2/5 in Vietnam. It will be called "Battlelines". Dave estimates that sometime early in

2005 he will have the book 95% complete with just some final editing to be done. I am sure he would like to thank all that contributed.

In addition we all enjoyed each others company at various meals and there was even an outdoor concert. Also the hotel had some great shows that we all enjoyed. We gathered in the hospitality room on Saturday morning and we held our annual meeting. Here we chose our new officers. Besides electing the president we added a Vice President this year. # Letter from Glenda Carter widow of Bruce L. Carter Fox

Dear Fox 2/5,

I want to say thank you to all of you who were at the 2004 Reunion in Reno. Thank you for allowing me to share from my heart and thank you for your support. A special thanks to all of you who worked so hard to organize the reunion and to Chris Brown for helping so many of us find each other.

My husband Bruce was very proud to be a Marine and I am proud to be an extended family member of the 2/5 Marines. As some of you know, Bruce, along with six others was killed September II, 1968 in an ambush near Liberty Bridge. So many of you have helped me to heal from my unresolved grief by sharing information and your personal experiences. Some of you that I have spoken with were not at this reunion but I thank you also and hope you will make it to the next reunion. I know you will be welcomed with open arms. I have found it to be true, Marines are loyal and take care of their own.

The healing process is helped along by connecting with other people and talking, laughing and crying together as memories return. Sometimes there are just no words to express the feelings so a hand shake or a hug says it all.

My personal war with grief is coming to an end. I am once again feeling hopeful and peaceful (most of the time.) It is good to be alive.

The book I am writing, <u>Sacred Shadow</u>, <u>Sacred Ground</u>: will soon be finished. The first limited printing of this book will be available to family, friends, Widows of the Vietnam War, wives of Veterans and members of my extended family of Marines in 2/5.

I will send detailed information as it becomes available. Those of you who are interested can purchase your copy before I extend the offer to the general public and before it goes to national publication.

I hope to see you in Washington D. C. this November 2004 when I plan to leave a copy of my book at the wall in memory of my husband Bruce Carter and the other six Marines who died with him that night. Members of the other families will also try to attend. Details of when and where are in the making. If you are interested in attending you can contact me directly through my e-mail address listed below. Other places to find information will be through this newsletter or through Chris Brown whom I will make sure has the information by the end of September.

I have not been able to find family members or pictures of Billy Joe Scott and George William Mc Gee. If anyone can help locate their family I would appreciate the help.

Thank you again and may God richly bless each one of you as we welcome each other home.



I am well. Hope you are. Tell Brother Walt and Brother Elmer the Marine Corps beats working for old man Minch by a mile. Tell them to join up quick before maybe all of the places are filled. I was restless at first because you got to stay in bed till nearly 6 a.m., but am getting so I like to sleep late.

Tell Walt and Elmer all you do before breakfast is smooth your cot and shine some things. No hogs to slop, feed to pitch, mash to mix, wood to split, fire to lay. Practically nothing. Men got to shave but it is not so bad, there's warm water. Breakfast is strong on trimmings like fruit juice, cereal, eggs, bacon, etc., but kind of weak on chops, potatoes, ham, steak, fried eggplant, pie and other regular food. But tellWalt and Elmer you can always sit by the two city boys that live on coffee. Their food plus yours holds you till noon when you get fed again. It's no wonder these city boys can't walk much.

We go on "route" marches, which the Platoon Sergeant says are long walks to harden us. If he thinks so, it is not my place to tell him different.

A "route march" is about as far as to our mailbox at home. Then the city guys get sore feet and we all ride back in trucks. The country is nice, but awful flat.

The Sergeant is like a schoolteacher. He nags some. The Captain is like the school board. Majors and Colonels just ride around and frown. They don't bother you

This next will kill Walt and Elmer with laughing. I keep getting medals for shooting. I don't know why. The bulls-eye is near as big as a chipmunk head and don't move. And it ain't shooting at you, like the Higgett boys at home. All you got to do is lie there all comfortable and hit it. You don't even load your own cartridges. They come in boxes.

Then we have what they call hand-to-hand combat training. You get to wrestle with them city boys.

I have to be real careful though, they break real easy. It ain't like fighting with that ole bull at home. I'm about the best they got in this except for that Tug Jordan from over in Silver Lake. He joined up the same time as me. But I'm only 5'6" and 130 pounds and he's 6'8" and weighs near 300 pounds dry.

Be sure to tell Walt and Elmer to hurry and join before other fellers get onto this setup and come stampeding in.





# FOX 2/5 SAYS GOODBYETO "BERNIE"

Thomas Robert "Bernie" Burnham, age 67, passed away June 27, 2004 at his home in Norfolk, Va. Born in Scranton, Pennsylvania, he was proceeded in death by his parents, Gertrude and Byron Burnham and his brother, Joseph, killed in Vietnam; and a sister, Mary.

He is survived by a brother, William, who lives in Milton, New Jersey; and several cousins.

He was a retired CWO-4 in the US Marine Corps. A decorated Vietnam veteran at the battle of Hue, he was thus awarded Navy Cross and Bronze Star.

A wake service with VFW honors were held June 30th at Hollomon-Brown Funeral Home, Tidewater Drive Chapel.

On August 19, 2004, Thomas "Bernie" Burnham was taken to his final resting place at Arlington National Cemetery. Bernie was given full burial rights befitting of the hero that he was.

Besides his family, his Fox 2/5 brothers were there in force led by Gen. Mike Downs, his skipper and Tom Martin, his platoon commander, a strong contingent of third platoon members and others. With his casket on a horse drawn caisson, a Marine Corps band, rifle platoon, firing squad and pall bearers gave us all a lump in our throats as we said goodbye to one of our heroes. Afterwards we all got together for a drink and to toast one of our greatest members.
