Trip to Vietnam

Since the last newsletter I have returned to Vietnam with Pete Korn, John Robertson, JD Moore and Kurt Leudtke. Also with us was Pete's son Dan and Kurt's wife Janice. We left Los Angeles in the early morning hours of May 9th and returned on the afternoon of May 22nd. It was a consensus of all that made the trip that it was a very meaningful and rewarding trip. Personally I couldn't think of a greater group of people to be with. Here is the recap of the trip that I put on the website:

We went with Frontline Battlefield Tours and Bill Stillwagen was our guide. Let me endorse both as they made our trip an excellent one

The trip started in Hanoi and although interesting did little except for the visit to the Hanoi Hilton and the John McCain memorial. We visited Marine House where we had a few beers and played some darts and pool with the Marines who stand security for the US embassy. We then went to Hue City where we toured the streets that Fox Company fought on back in 1968. All I can say as a flood of memories came back. Although the city is changing much is still the same.

Our guide was very informative on what happened in other areas such as the Citadel side. It helped us understand what went one in other areas of the battle. After a couple of days in Hue we went up north. We visited Quang Tri, Dong Ha, Cam Lo, Con Thien and Gio Linh with a quick Op across the DMZ. Then it was over to Khe Sanh with spots like Camp Carroll, Vandergrift and the Army base of Lang Vei visited along the way. Again our guide was very well versed on what went on up there.

I don't know which was worse sloshing through the rice paddies

or humping those hills up along the DMZ. After a quick trip back to Hue through the Da Krong and A Shau Valleys (another eye opener) we started our trek south towards Danang.

On the way we stopped and went up Bach Ma again. Believe me it was better driving up. JD, Kurt and I couldn't believe that we hacked our way up the side back in 68. We continued on and stopped at the Bowling Alley area. It hadn't changed much. We thought about going skinny dipping like the last time but decided against it. After a lunch in a nice resort in Lan Co we stopped in Hai Van Pass. I had never been there but JD showed us where they pushed the skivvie house off the hill. The big French bunkers were still there.

Then it was on to Danang stopping at Red Beach and Namo beaches on our way to the hotel. The next day we went to the Que Son valley and the site of the battle of Union II. We performed an American Indian memorial ceremony for the men who died in that battle while we were there. We then drove through the mountains to Non Song (The Coal Mines). Nothing much had changed here except it had grown up a little and they have a brand new bridge crossing the river. From here it was on to An Hoa. The air strip was still there and with the pictures I brought it was easy to zero in on our old Fox Co. location.

The German hospital was in ruins but still there. We drove up Liberty road and stopped at the site of the 9/11/68 ambush where 7 of our brothers were killed. We went to Liberty Bridge (no bridge at this time) but Pete and Robby pointed out the sites of Go Noi Island and others.

Current Fox 2/5 Updates

from Chris Brown,

I have asked the current members of Fox Company to provide us with an update from time to time. Below are updates from 2nd and 3rd platoons.

2nd Platoon;

This edition was provided by Sqt. Keonekelaoha Fatiaki, who was 1st Sq. leader, 2nd Platoon during the last deployment to Iraq.

Currently Fox 2/5 is training for the green side but staying true to our desert side. (green for the jungle). As of right now we are looking at being apart of the (MEU)Marine Expeditionary Unit which is station in Okinawa and aboard ships. We would be the security around that area. Last year 3rd Marines in Hawaii went straight to Iraq after spending only about 2 months in Okinawa. We'll be that second string player waiting to go to any part of the world in a moments notice. A company is made up of 3 platoons and 1 weapons platoons which consists of Machineguns, Mortars, and Assault men.

In Iraq we divided weapons equally to make 4 platoons so that our daily burdens would be equally distributed among 4 platoons instead of just 3 platoons. This year we will be staying with the traditional set up. We've had about 40-50 new marines out of boot camp from the west coast 5-10 of them being non-commissioned officers from elsewhere like security forces, Edson Range, etc.

Compared to last year we are still a little under 50% short of new marines. The majority of our Marines are combat tested. We will be getting more Marines from the East Coast in a couple of weeks.

Our C.O. is Captain Brooks. He came to us from 3rd Marines. X.O. is 1st Lt. Jones who was 1st platoon's commander last year in Iraq. Company 1st Sgt. Is GySgt Tracy who was our company GySgt, last year and is awaiting promotion this year. Company GySqt is SSqt Kesl who is picking up GySqt later this year. Platoon Sqt's are 1st platoon SSGT Johnson (came from Golf Co., served in Iraq), 2nd Platoon SSGT Dolan (last year's Fox 1st platoon Guide), 3rd Platoon SSGT Roy(he was 2nd Platoon's last year, missed promotion so volunteered for our worst platoon) and finally weapons is SSGT Bartlett who is picking up GySgt this year and he also came to us from Golf Company.

3rd Platoon;

Well sir ill talk to my XO to see if we can facilitate some of this info to you. From what I am told we are going to the 13th MEU to Okinawa but how will that go I haven't got a clue. Our work up is more on MEU than going to Iraq. I hope we go back to Iraq, its better to do something than doing exercises on a MEU. I am having fun now some of my fellow Sgt in my platoon are old buddies from 1/2 back in '98, small world.

Well that's all for now, sir.




Katrina and Fox 2/5


From the editor:

Some more trivia you don't get to see much of in the U.S. news media

Did you know that 47 countries have re-established their embassies in Iraq?

Did you know that the Iraqi current government employs 1.2 million Iraqi people?

Did you know that 3100 schools have been renovated, 364 schools are under rehabilitation, 263 schools are now under construction and 38 new schools have been built in Iraq?

Did you know that Iraq's higher educational structure consists of 20 Universities, 46 Institutes or colleges and 4 research centers, all currently operating?

Did you know that 25 Iraq students departed for the United States in January 2005 for the re-established Fulbright program?

Did you know that the Iraqi Navy is operational? They have 5 - 100-foot patrol craft, 34 smaller vessels and a navel infantry regiment.

Did you know that Iraq's Air Force consists of three operational squadrons, which includes 9 reconnaissance and 3 US C-130 transport aircraft (under Iraqi operational control) which operate day and night, and will soon add 16 UH-1 helicopters and 4 bell jet rangers?

Did you know that Iraq has a counter-terrorist unit and a Commando Battalion?

Did you know that the Iraqi Police Service has over 55,000 fully trained and equipped police officers?

Did you know that there are 5 Police Academies in Iraq that produce over 3500 new officers each 8 weeks?

Did you know there are more than 1100 building projects going on in Iraq? They include 364 schools, 67 public clinics, 15 hospitals, 83 railroad stations, 22 oil facilities, 93 water facilities and 69 electrical facilities.

Did you know that 96% of Iraqi children under the age of 5 have received the first 2 series of polio vaccinations?

Did you know that 4.3 million Iraqi children were enrolled in primary school by mid October?

Did you know that there are 1,192,000 cell phone subscribers in Iraq and phone use has gone up 158%?

Did you know that Iraq has an independent media that consist of 75 radio stations, 180 newspapers and 10 television stations?

Did you know that the Baghdad Stock Exchange opened in June of 2004?

Did you know that 2 candidates in the Iraqi presidential election had a recent televised debate recently?

OF COURSE WE DIDN'T KNOW! WHY DIDN'T WE KNOW? -OUR MEDIA WOULDN'T TELL US!

Instead of reflecting our love for our country, we get photos of flag burning incidents at Abu Ghraib and people throwing snowballs at presidential motorcades.

This speaks volumes of our Marine brotherhood.

There were two guys I served with in the Corps that I feel as though I was closer to than my own brothers.

One I went through every day of training with, from boot camp, to home on boot leave on the same plane, (he was from Circleville, Ohio, about 60 miles up the road), to Nam on the same plane. We were inseparable. He went to India 3/5. We were even

able to visit briefly a couple times at An Hoa when both of our companies were in the rear at the same time. He was KIA on 6/29/69, and I wondered for 35 years the circumstances of how he died.

I posted a message on the 3/5 website and within a week I was able to speak to two Marines who were with him the night he was killed. All my questions were answered and those 3/5 Marines were just phenomenal in their efforts to help me.

Nothing comes close to the brotherhood of Marines!!

Closing thoughts



Don't know whether you heard about this but Denzel Washington and his family visited the troops at Brook Army Medical Center, in San Antonio, Texas (BAMC) the other day. This is where soldiers that have been evacuated from Germany come to be hospitalized in the States, especially burn victims. They have buildings there called Fisher Houses. The Fisher House is a hotel where soldiers' families can stay, for little or no charge, while their soldier is staying in the hospital. BAMC has quite a few of these houses on base but as you can imagine, they are almost completely filled most of the time.

While Denzel Washington was visiting BAMC, they gave him a tour of one of the Fisher Houses. He asked how much one of them would cost to build. He took his check book out and wrote a check for the full amount right there on the spot. The soldiers overseas were amazed to hear this story and want to get the word out to the American public, because it warmed their hearts to hear it.

The question I have is why does Alec Baldwin, Modonna, Sean Penn and other Hollywood types make front page news with their anti-everything America crap and this doesn't even make page 3 in the Metro section of any newspaper except the base newspaper in San Antonio.
