Welcome aboard to our two new vice presidents. JD Moore and Bobby Smith I will be counting on them to get the word out to all our members via e-mail and phone calls. I figure if we share the load and each take a portion of the roster we can get to all our guys with a personal invite to the next reunion at Cody Wyoming. I have been in contact with both and, with the work already done by Donna we are well on the way to a successful reunion in Cody. I was struck by the changes we have under gone in the past twenty odd years since this thing of ours began. Quite obvious are the physical changes, but more so in the attitudes exhibited, the ease of association with one another and generally an air of satisfaction, and I might add accomplishment. We are I think "at ease" with ourselves and the world we live in, confident in our long held beliefs, sure of decisions made long ago, and yes even vindicated by history.

Twenty years prior to the initial meetings that resulted in our organization, and the subsequent reunions, we stood in the rice paddies, the jungle canopy and in the streets of Hue. We stood in the way of what was then the seemingly inevitable spread of communism across the globe. Cuba had fallen not six years earlier, the Caribbean, indeed all of South America it seemed was I pledge to you my best efforts as your new president. under attack by communist subversive forces. The Berlin Wall had recently been constructed and the race to control space was very hot and very much in doubt.

Twenty years ago, at half time in our lives, we were emerging from what had been for most of us, if not all, a traumatic time. Of the men and women of our generation we were the ones who had chosen to defend the nation during a period of great national turmoil and danger. We were the ones who fought the "unpopular" war. We were the ones who answered President Kennedy's call to "support any friend and oppose any foe in defense of liberty'. We were also, unique in American history, the only American warriors to be greeted by our fellow citizens, upon our return, with indifference at best and open hostility in all too many cases.

That things had changed for us, and much to the better, came home to me as I addressed the membership at the dinner. Almost exactly twenty years before, at a hotel within shouting distance of the one we were in, I had addressed the same dinner. The feelings I expressed at that time I expressed again at this year's dinner. Recounting the extraordinary accomplishments and unrivaled heroism of the "men in this room" and voicing my utter contempt for those who had mocked and derided us during that painful time I again pointed to the audience and said "Ya done good...va done real good" as I had twenty years before.

After the dinner a number of men approached me to offer compliments and thanks for the things I said and I appreciated that and thanked them in turn. But there was a dramatic difference over all in the tone and attitude of those who approached me.

Twenty years before in that other hotel ball room I had followed a succession of speakers to the podium who made remarks, entirely appropriate, lamenting the men lost and the hardships endured. None had addressed what to me was the other side of our story of Fox 2/5 in Vietnam and that was that as a military unit we had inflicted enormous losses on the enemy. Or as I indelicately put it at the time "We kicked ass from the DMZ to An Hoa to Hue City and back again". At the time it brought a roar of approval from the men present and their loved ones and when I concluded with the "Ya done good" part they were on their feet cheering. That the same line drew applause, but not the cheering, foot stomping response it did twenty years ago brought home the thoughts I expressed earlier. We know we "done good" we no longer have to have someone tells us we did.

I appreciate your confidence and support and I will do my best to justify it. Please contact me with your thoughts and ideas on how we can better serve the membership. 

From the Locater—Chris Brown:




